library services while we were closed, it was difficult not seeing our library visitors. We missed you! COVID-19 has certainly had an impact on the library. As we reopen, we must do it in a way that keeps you and the staff safe. Services and hours are modified. Bear with us as we try the best as we can to provide the library services that you have come to expect under the requirements of reopening. Masks and social distancing are a must. Hand sanitizer will be available throughout the building. Building capacity will be limited to 50%. Only adults are allowed in Children's Services for now. Four teens can be in the Teen Room at the same time. Feel free to browse the stacks but we do encourage brief visits, initially. Adult and teen computers are available for 30 minutes. (And while we were closed, the Computer Center was moved to a new location). The Magazine Room is not yet open but we can retrieve titles for you to borrow. The Jefferson Branch is closed to the public until further notice. Curbside pickup and printing will continue to be offered at the main library and the branch. Libraries are not sending out books yet so you will need to pick those up at the other library. Our programing has gone virtual and it has been a success! Check out the library's YouTube channel for a variety of helpful tutorials on a few of our services. The Community Room is the quarantine area for returns and large group gatherings are not yet permitted. It will be awhile before the room is available for use by community groups or for our in person programs. We hope that as conditions improve, we will be able to offer more.

Friends of the New Britain Public Library

We are all living in uncertain times. The coronavirus caused the Friends' Spring Book Sale to be canceled and, because the library has been closed, our inventory of books now fills all available storage space. Unfortunately, we will be unable to accept donations of books until further notice.

In April, with schools and library closed, the Friends distributed almost 500 gently used books to pre-school through 6th grade children through the New Britain School District's meals program. This prompted grants to the Friends from two New Britain families to purchase new books for New Britain kids in need. One grant of \$1,000 came from a donor advised fund of the Community Foundation of Greater New Britain, the other a personal grant of \$250. Both grantors wish to remain anonymous. We thank them for their generosity and commitment to the children of New Britain. With these funds, 400+ brand new books were purchased from First Book, a non-profit that provides books and learning materials to kids in need, to be distributed trough the District's meals program. Many thanks to the School District and to Amy Litke, Children's Librarian, who helped us choose the books for this program.


Black Lives Matter: Community Reads available for instant access on Overdrive or Libby —No waitlists!

Until July 15th, the downloadable audiobook of Michelle Alexander's New York Times bestseller The New Jim Crow: Mass Incarceration in the Age of Colorblindness will be available for simultaneous access with no waitlist. Named one of the Most Influential Books of the Last 20 Years by the Chronicle of Higher Education and winner of the NAACP Image Award for Nonfiction, Alexander's critically acclaimed book examines racial disparities through the lens of mass incarceration.

The second title, an ebook, Me and White Supremacy: Combat Racism, Change the World, and Become a Good Ancestor by Layla F. Saad will be available for instant access until July 12. This New York Times bestseller is based on the viral me and white supremacy Instagram challenge and provides a framework for readers to dismantle the privilege within themselves.
